

ACCELERATED READER

Library Incentive Program – Grades 2–8

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The OLF Library AR Incentive Program is designed as a challenge for students to go above and beyond what is already expected of them on the classroom level for AR. Classroom expectations are for students to meet their individual goals and maintain an 85% or better comprehension average on their AR quizzes. What students do beyond that, to challenge themselves, will be recognized and rewarded by the library.

POINT CLUBS

Students earning AR points continuously throughout the school year

DOUBLE DIPPERS

Students doubling their individual AR goals each quarter

MILLIONAIRES

Students reading over 1 million words or more

TOP READERS

5 students per grade level with the highest amount of AR points for the year

LIBRARY INCENTIVES

POINT CLUBS

Each grade level is given a specific number of AR points to begin earning their *Brag Tags* and signing the *Point Club Banners*.

- 2nd/3rd grade - 15 Point Club
- 4th grade - 25 Point Club
- 5th/6th grade - 50 Point Club
- 7th/8th grade - 75 Point Club

Point Clubs continue beyond 75 points. Students can move through one or more clubs per quarter. (100, 150, 200, 300, 400, 500, 750, 1000). Throughout the school year,

student names and point club levels will be awarded and announced.

In addition to earning the *Brag Tags* and signing the banners, *AR Club Coupons* will be awarded to those students entering Point Clubs AND maintaining 85% or better comprehension. These *AR Club Coupons* will be accepted in Library, Reading Classes and Elementary Homerooms ONLY. The uses of the coupon will be different from teacher to teacher. Some examples could be but are not limited to: lunch buddy, free shoe day, bring a snack, bathroom pass, etc.

DOUBLE DIPPERS

Students who double or more their individual goals and maintain an 85% or better comprehension average per quarter will be rewarded with a special treat in the library.

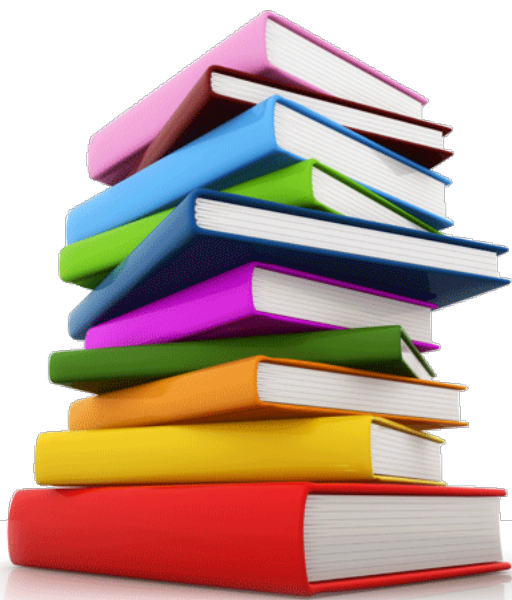
The library will designate a day at the end of each quarter for the Double Dipper Party. Students will receive an invitation for entrance into the party.

MILLIONAIRE CLUB

Students who read one million words and more will join the MillionAiRe Club. These students will “pose” as MillionAiRes and have their picture posted on our MillionAire Wall. For each one million words read, their name will go into the MillionAiRe Raffle to win a prize at the end of the school year.

TOP READERS

At the end of the school year, the top 5 students who have earned the most AR points in their grade level while maintaining an 85% or better comprehension average will receive the AR Top 5 Award.



CLASSROOM AR EXPECTATIONS

(Grades 2-8)

- Students will be given individual point goals per quarter. Goals will be set according to student ZPD ranges generated from the STAR test and teacher/student discretion.
- The AR grade will be calculated as 2 grades, that of which will total 20 points.
 - One 10 point grade will reflect the % of point goal met.
 - The other 10 point grade will reflect the average % correct on quizzes taken.
- AR Quarter Deadlines will be set 2 days before the official end of the nine weeks.
- **2nd GRADE** - The AR grade will take effect in the 2nd semester (the last 2 nine weeks). Students will be introduced to the process and practice for the 1st semester (the first 2 nine weeks).

1ST GRADE & AR

- First graders will be introduced to the steps in the AR process after the start of the school year.
- During the 1st semester, students will become familiar with logging in and out of the AR database. They will learn how to search for AR quizzes and complete the test taking process, all in the library.
- During the 2nd semester, students will take the STAR test and learn how to find books that fall in their ZPD reading range. During this time, students will be given the opportunity to test independently in their classroom or in the library on books they have selected and read in class or at home.
- There are no assigned goals or grades for AR in First Grade. This is their year of learning how it all works.
